Grow in Blessedness

...for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven. ...for they will be comforted. ...for they will inherit the land. ...for they will be satisfied. ...for they will be shown mercy. ...for they will see God. ...for they will be called children of God. ...for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven. ...for your reward will be great in heaven. (See Matthew 5)

Listed above are all the rewards of living the Beatitudes. Read them slowly and prayerfully. Do you desire these good fruits? These rewards of the Beatitudes? It's a good spiritual practice to start with the reward, the effect of something, and to let the desire for that reward grow. The same is true of sin. It's a good practice, especially when one struggles with a habitual sin, to start with the effect of that sin (the negative effect) and ask whether or not you desire it.

Once we've concluded, with a deep conviction, that we desire the fruits of the Beatitudes, we then only need to add the first step. We insert the Beatitude into this desire so that we can understand and believe that the Beatitude is good and desirous. But what about the Beatitudes? Do you desire...

To be poor in spirit, to mourn, to be meek, to hunger and thirst for righteousness, to be merciful, to be clean of heart, to be a peacemaker, to accept persecution for the sake of righteousness, and to be insulted and persecuted and to have every kind of evil uttered about you falsely because of Jesus?

Some seem desirous while others seem burdensome. But if these Beatitudes are properly understood in the context of their fruits (i.e., the blessings they produce), then our desire for the means to that good fruit (the Beatitude) should grow as well.

Perhaps, today, you can look at which Beatitude is most difficult for you to want and desire. Once you find it, look at the fruit it produces and spend time looking at that Beatitude within that context. It will help you grow in blessedness!

#### **PROTOCOLS in COVID-19 PANDEMIC**

> As per the Archdiocese, the protocols for churches are STATUS QUO (existing state of affairs) – Parishes are permitted to safely accommodate 30% capacity. At Christ the King Parish, there can be a total of about 90 people. [UPDATE from Archdiocese re. Clarification for Weddings & Funerals ~ At present, weddings and funerals are be limited to five people in Winnipeg and the Capital Region currently under Code Orange Alert. HOWEVER, weddings and funerals can have more than five people (See Appendix 2) in attendance if: i) the number of persons attending does not exceed 30 % of the usual capacity of the church; ii) the church is physically divided into separate areas which contain no more than five persons each, and iii) persons in each area are prevented into coming into close proximity with persons in another area during the gathering, as well as entering or leaving.]

> As required by Law for contact purposes: **SIGN-UP** when you arrive for Mass with name & contact info; **OR... PHONE or EMAIL** the Parish Office (before Fridays at 12noon).

> **WEARING of MASKS** ~ For LOVE of NEIGHBOR, please strongly consider wearing a mask for the short period of time we are celebrating Mass together.

> **HUMMING** ~ While it is recommended that we don't sing out loud yet, please softly and actively hummmmmmm along with the songs & acclamations the Music Ministers lead.

> Continue to be conscious and mindful of one another, and to



use wisdom and good common sense to determine and keep the safe 2 meter (6 ft.) **PHYSICAL DISTANCING**, particularly during Communion. Please don't bunch up. Take your time - there is no rush.


Corner
