- 3. For more understanding... Hail Mary ...
- 4. For more conscious acts of justice ... Hail Mary ...
- 5. For an increased attentiveness to others... Hail Mary ...
- 6. For more effective communication... Hail Mary ...
- 7. For faster forgiveness... Hail Mary ...
- 8. For kinder thoughts and attitudes... Hail Mary ...
- 9. For peace in all our hearts... Hail Mary ...
- 10. And add your own special phrases... Hail Mary ... Close your prayer with the Glory be to the Father... &
